## Boys in Italy Send Celebrezze Scroll

A beautifully illuminated parchment scroll was received yesterday by Municipal Judge Frank D. Celebrezze from a boys' town in Santa Marinella, Italy, which he was instrumental in founding.

Judge Celebrezze was made honorary founder of the town, which was begun in 1946 with a nucleus of 20 orphaned boys who were found roaming around Italy. At the time he was the head of the American Relief for Italy Committee, of which he is now honorary president.

The 18-by-30-inch scroll is bordered by red, blue and yellow illustrations of the area in which the boys' town is located, has a delicately lettered inscription commending the judge for his aid and is signed by the boy officials

of the town.

The American Relief for Italy Committee has aided the town since its founding by Msgr. Carroll-Abbing, who came here last year. In 1950 the group received one night's proceeds from the picture "The Bicycle Thief" and auctioned off a carload of lettuce for \$6,000 to help pay the expenses for the boys' town.
